Chapel Roof Replaced

This summer, just before Tahosa opened for the summer camp season, we were finally able to coordinate weather, availability of the roofing contractor and the absence of campers in order to replace the failing roof on the chapel with high quality metal roofing that matches the other buildings at Tahosa. The cost of the project was just under \$7,000, which was covered in part by over \$3,700 in memorial donations from numerous friends and family members of TAA member Dr. Mike Logan, who passed away in May, 2016. Dr. Logan's widow lives in Tennessee, and continues as a member of TAA.

Significant additional funding came from TAA members Donald and Marilyn Seymour. The cost of the project was reduced \$450 through the help of the camp staff by hauling out the old roofing material.

Scouting Museum Teaches History, Preserves Artifacts

2018 marks an important milestone for Camp Tahosa, and for the Scouting Heritage Museum. Camp Tahosa was established in 1938 and remains a vibrant part of camping (both summer and winter) for Boy Scouts in the Denver Area Council. Eighty years and thousands of scouts later, Camp Tahosa is a nationally recognized location for scouts to gather and practice the ideals of the Boy Scouts. Much newer, though not as well known, the Scouting Heritage Museum shares the history of Scouting and is celebrating its fourth anniversary.

Sponsored and staffed by members of the Tahosa Alumni Association, the museum has quickly become a destination point for scouters hoping to learn more about the history of the Boy Scouts of America, particularly scouting in Colorado. The Tahosa Alumni Association, incorporated in 1981 to help save the camp, but formed informally in the 1960's, has been working for the past dozen years to establish a location for a museum. However, it was just in the last five years that both a location and a large part of their collections became available. The Denver Area Council, located near 6th Ave. and Kipling in Lakewood, found themselves able to offer a space to the Alumni Association, and a generous donation from Bob and Aileen Munger, of Arvada, gave the museum the jump-start it needed. Collecting for more than forty years, anything they could find related to scouting, the Mungers had established a museum in their basement and were ready to let their collection find a new home. A home that would hopefully expose their collection of everything from handbooks, to uniforms, to camping equipment, to a whole new generation of young scouters. Included in this collection of thousands of items is a collection (popular after World War 1); merit badges both current and discontinued; as well as fifty-plus years of Boy's Life magazine, which is one of the favorite items for young scouts visiting the museum.

Over the course of the last four years, the museum staff has been working hard, not only sharing the collections, but becoming a more professionally run and managed museum. Curator and Museum Director John Meeker, Librarian/Registrars Dorothea Lindsey and Nancy Nibling, Preparators Frank Lindsey and Stan Paprocki, and Communications Director/Docent Trainer Dana Seymour meet weekly to accept donations, catalog artifacts, prepare exhibits and greet visitors. Additionally, several of the staff are certified merit badge counselors, and meet with groups of boys, helping them to earn their Scouting Heritage merit badge. Local scouts are fortunate in that one of the requirements of this merit badge is that they visit a scouting history museum, which means that Denver area scouts do not have to travel far to satisfy this requirement. The museum is a member of the Mountain and Plains Museum Association, which helps it to bring a higher level of professionalism to the presentation of its collections and the education of its visitors.

Located at the Hamilton Scout Headquarters of the Denver Area Council, the Scouting Heritage Museum is currently open on Tuesdays from 10AM to 2PM. The museum is looking for volunteers to serve as docents. With more docents, the museum would be able to open more days in the week, allowing more people to share in the history of the Boy Scout movement.
